Start High School Hall of Fame 2018 Inductees

Willy Aey - While Willy may not be a graduate of Start High School, his three children are. Once they entered, Willy became active in the Spartan community by helping raise funds for the stadium lights and being active in the Sideliners organization. You could usually find him inside the concession stand from open to close, assisting with its operation. During the weekend and through the week, Willy would replenish the supplies and travel to several stores to find the best deals.

Robert L. Beattie - Robert, a 1974 graduate of Start, was very involved in student life. He played football all four years, was president his sophomore class and the debate team, as well as Student Body Government president. Upon graduation, he was awarded a full scholarship through the ROTC Naval Program at the University of Florida, later transferring to Miami University of Ohio. Originally trained to be a pilot, he became a submarine commander, and served in Desert Storm.

Dennis D. Hall - In his own words, Denny would say he was "late bloomer". During his years at Start (1964-1968) he wasn't a great student and spent much of his time in the Industrial Arts wing. After Start, Denny ended up graduating with honors from Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University in 1975. Also in 1975, Denny was commissioned as an officer and pilot in the U.S. Navy, serving until 1988. He continued his love for flying up to his untimely death on May 26, 2017.

Chris Lyons - Chris, a 1984 graduate, was an outstanding trumpet player at Start, participating in the marching, jazz, concert, and pep bands as well as the orchestra. Following graduation, Chris obtained his bachelor's degree from the University of Toledo, and became a music teacher at Evergreen Schools. Chris has spent the last 27 years teaching music to 6th through 12th graders at Evergreen, growing the program from just 13 students to one that now includes a third of the student body. In the process Chris has gained many awards for the school.

Jeff Meyers - A 1971 graduate of Start, Jeff was very active in many extracurricular activities. He played football and baseball all four years, basketball for two, and was a member of the All-City baseball team as a utility player. Jeff was also a member of Quill & Dagger and served as Sports Editor for the Shield yearbook. Upon graduating, Jeff started at the University of Toledo but decided instead to enroll in trade school to become an electrician. When his children began their time at Start, Jeff came with them, becoming very active in Sideliners and all of their fundraising efforts.

Elyse Anaszewicz Quint - A 2005 graduate, Elyse was president of both DECA and the Latin Club, captain of the cheerleaders, and was president of her senior class. She graduated with a 4.3 grade point average, ranking her 8th in a class of 323. Elyse has volunteered for many organizations such as Ronald McDonald House, Toys for Tots, and St. Catherine Catholic Church. Elyse is a proud graduate of Bowling Green State University, majoring in apparel manufacturing and product development. She worked for 12 years at President Tuxedo as a corporate trainer. She remains busy as a volunteer DECA judge, serving Ohio and Michigan. In her church, Elyse serves as a Bible Study Fellowship group leader and is Christian Education board secretary.

Kim Carstensen Whetstone - While at Start, Kim was on the Galaxy staff, a member of Peris and National Honor Society, and was active with Student Body Government. Additionally, she was a member of both Homecoming and Christmas Queen courts. Kim enjoys helping her family, her Class of 1974 Reunion committee, and many other organizations. She volunteers with Vacation Bible School and is a volunteer reading teacher at Sherman school. Dedicated to helping women abroad, Kim sells products from "BeadforLife", an organization that empowers women in Uganda by reducing poverty and inspiring entrepreneurship.
